


Anguilla is easily reached by a 20-minute water taxi service from Marigot on Saint Martin's north coast.

St. Barts is further away and can be reached on a longer (and much choppier) ferry ride or by plane.

Saba is the furthest away and Winair's turboprop flights are the best way to get there.



Anguilla The beach at Shoal Bay East is considered one of the 10 best in the Caribbean.
























Saba, part of the Netherlands Antilles, is a tiny volcanic island, 28 miles south of St. Maarten.



Winair's DeHavilland Twin Otter flights are the best way to get to Saba.




Saba Saba Airport, seen from the highway (not from the air)

Saba The total population of the island is only about 1,500.




Boats on the sea are tiny specs in this view from The Bottom.
